Dear Officer Scheuerman,

As you may be aware, on July 17, 2019, the California Building Standards Commission certified emergency building standards proposed by the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) to implement CHA's sponsored bill from last year, Assembly Bill (AB) 2190 (Chapter 673, Statutes of 2018).

That legislation granted specified hospitals the opportunity to apply for an extension of the January 1, 2020, seismic compliance deadline. It also required general acute care hospitals with buildings that do not substantially comply with seismic safety standards to attest that their board of directors is aware that the buildings are required to meet the January 1, 2030, compliance deadline.

Per Assembly Bill 2190 (2018) under Health & Safety Code Section 130066, we are submitting this attestation letter to certify that our Board of Directors are aware that our hospital has not yet met the 2030 seismic safety requirements for all of its buildings; specifically, one or more of the buildings at our facility has performance ratings less than SPC-3 "or" NPC-5, and therefore our hospital is required to meet the January 1, 2030 deadline for substantial compliance with the seismic safety regulations or standards.
