Council Reflection – March 2024

Reviewed the Council's impact over the past two years and discussed strategies for informing HCAI's workforce development while shaping the future of California's health workforce.

 - . Establishment of behavioral health scholarship program
 - Advancement of GME consortium discussions
 - . Integration of Council recommendations into HCAI's nursing initiative
 - Role in influencing policy changes and strategic planning across various health workforce areas



Summary Council member's responses to survey:

- Areas of improvement and future meeting format considerations

Implement successful approaches to achieving program goals

 Implement through collective discussion/action during Council meetings and through a Council members professional role/organization/network.



Strategies on Council Roles Continued

Influence

Amplify successful ideas and innovations among external stakeholders

• Implement through collective discussion/action during Council meeting and through a Council member's professional role/organization/network.

Advocate for needed changes to remove barriers across systems

Implement through collective action by the Council through collective discussion/action

Advocate for increased resources to advance workforce solutions

Implement through collective action by the Council through collective discussion/action



Questions and Conflicts

- Council members need to be mindful of any specific organizational rules of their employers, such as identified incompatible activities.
- Council business will be at a statewide level, individual Council members' efforts to extend leading and advocating into their professional roles is unlikely to constitute Council business.
- If three or more members are involved in Council business or if two members are acting with authority delegated by the Council (a subcommittee), Bagley-Keene applies.
