Background: Expansion Funding Goal

• Increase the number of primary care residency slots in established programs serving areas of unmet need.



Background: Definition

At the 2018 Policy Meeting, the Commission approved a change to the New PCR Slots for Existing Programs Definition (Expansion Slots):

- A permanent increase in the number of Accreditation Council on Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) or American Osteopathic Association approved categorical primary care residency slots for an existing primary care program as evidenced by a letter from the appropriate accrediting body.
- OSHPD accepts an accreditation letter July 1, 2016 or later.
- Does not include programs filling unfilled slots from a prior accreditation letter.



Background:

Current Implementation

- FY 2020-21 Song-Brown PCR Grant Guide Guidance:
 - Eligible programs may receive \$300,000 per first year categorical slot
 - Maximum of three slots awarded
- Song-Brown Glossary does not specify when an expansion slot is fully funded.
- Programs can continue to apply for expansion funding until they have filled the total number of expanded slots.
 - Example: If a Program expands from 6 residents to 12 residents, they may apply for expansion funds until they have reached the full expansion to 12 residents.



Issue:

Definition of Approved Expansion

Example: Program approved to expand from 6 to 12 total residents (2-2-2 to 4-4-4).

Current

- Does a program receive funding until all three cohorts are filled to expansion?
 - Program receives funding year 1 to expand first year residents to 4.
 - Program receives funding year 2 to expand second first year cohort to 4.
 - Program receives funding year 3 to expand third first year cohort to 4.

Alternative

- Does a program receive funding for the first year of the cohort only?
 - Program receives funding year 1 to expand first year residents to 4.
 - Program receives no further funding as they have completed the expansion in first year slots



Issue: Clarification of Unfilled Slots

- Current definition does not allow funding of these programs.
 Example:
 - Program originally approved for 6 residents (2-2-2).
 - Program only has 3 residents (1-1-1).
 - Has not received an expansion approval letter.
- Is a program eligible for funding to fill the unfilled first year slot?



Current Expansion Definition: Analysis

2020 PCR Funding Meeting: HWDD staff presented an analysis of applicants in the last four application cycles (2017-2020):

- Some programs received funding for all their first-year expansion slots and in subsequent years applied for and received funding for the next cohort of first year residents.
- Some programs approved for multiple expansion slots stagger their funding requests over multiple years.
 - Difficult to track whether they are applying for the previously awarded slot or an unfilled expansion slot.
- One program requested expansion funding for unfilled existing residency slots, and OSHPD deemed ineligible.

Discussion

2020 FNP/PA Funding Meeting: Commission established a subcommittee to discuss the PCR expansion funding definition to:

- Clarify existing definition for those programs receiving permanent expansion letter.
- Specify whether and how to fund programs with unfilled slots that request expansion funding.



Subcommittee:

Recommendation

- Create two types of eligible programs
- Eligible program: Approved Expansion Letter
 - ACGME approval letter to permanently expand first-year categorical slots.
 - Has not received any prior expansion funding for the same permanent approval letter.
 - Has not filled all first year slots awarded in expansion letter
- Eligible program: Unfilled Accredited Slots
 - ACGME categorical first-year residency slots than have not been filled in last five years.




Subcommittee Recommendation:

New Expansion Programs

- ACGME approval letter showing permanent expansion of a specific number of slots.
- Eligible for Song-Brown expansion funding for first-year expansion slots only (grant is a 3-year award).
 - Ex: program receives approval to expand from 12 to 18 residents. This adds 2 new first year slots for a total of 6 additional program residents over three years at maturity (4-4-4 to 6-6-6).
 - Maximum number of slots they can apply for is 2.
 - Eligible for expansion funding until they fill all expanded first year slots.
 (One year they apply for one slot, and another year they apply for second slot.)



Subcommittee Recommendations: Process Flow for Expansion Programs






Subcommittee Recommendation:

Existing Unfilled Residency Positions

Programs with approved but unfilled existing residency slots are eligible *only* if those first-year slots have not been filled in the last 5 years.

Proposed Expansion Program Definitions

New Expansion Slots

- Permanent increase in the number of ACGME approved first-year categorical primary care residency slots for an existing primary care program (ACGME expansion letter dated July 1, 2016 or later)
- Has not received Song-Brown funding for all first-year slots.

Existing Unfilled Slot

 ACGME first-year categorical residency slots that have not been filled in the last 5 years.
