# Organizational Information

- CAFP CRN has over 70 FM residency program members across state of CA.
- John Muir Health Family Medicine Residency Program is a newly established, UCSF-affiliated, community-based, innovative and team-based 8-8-8 program in the East SF Bay Area
  - Our Residency Practice serves thousands of Medi-Cal patients through the CCHP Community Provider Network
- John Muir Health is not-for-profit, independent health system in the East Bay serving a broad mix of populations through 2 Medical Centers, 1 Behavioral Health Center, and a large network of primary care and specialty clinics.
  - JMH is now the largest provider of Medi-Cal acute care and ED visits in Contra Costa County

# GME Training and Education

- JMH FM Residency Program is a Clinic-First, team-based and innovative program. We have established a learning, leading, and caring residency community
  - We serve an all-payer population from charity care to Medi-Cal, Medicare, Primary Care First (CMS), and commercial payers. Over 50% of Residency Practice patients are CCHP Medi-Cal. (> 4,000 Medi-cal lives)
  - Our Residency Practice is an Advanced Primary Care site with robust inter-professional teamwork including Level 6 Integrated Behavioral Health, Lifestyle Medicine, and Pharmacist-assisted DM management.
  - We have inter-professional faculty including QI, Safety, BH, Pharmacy, Nursing

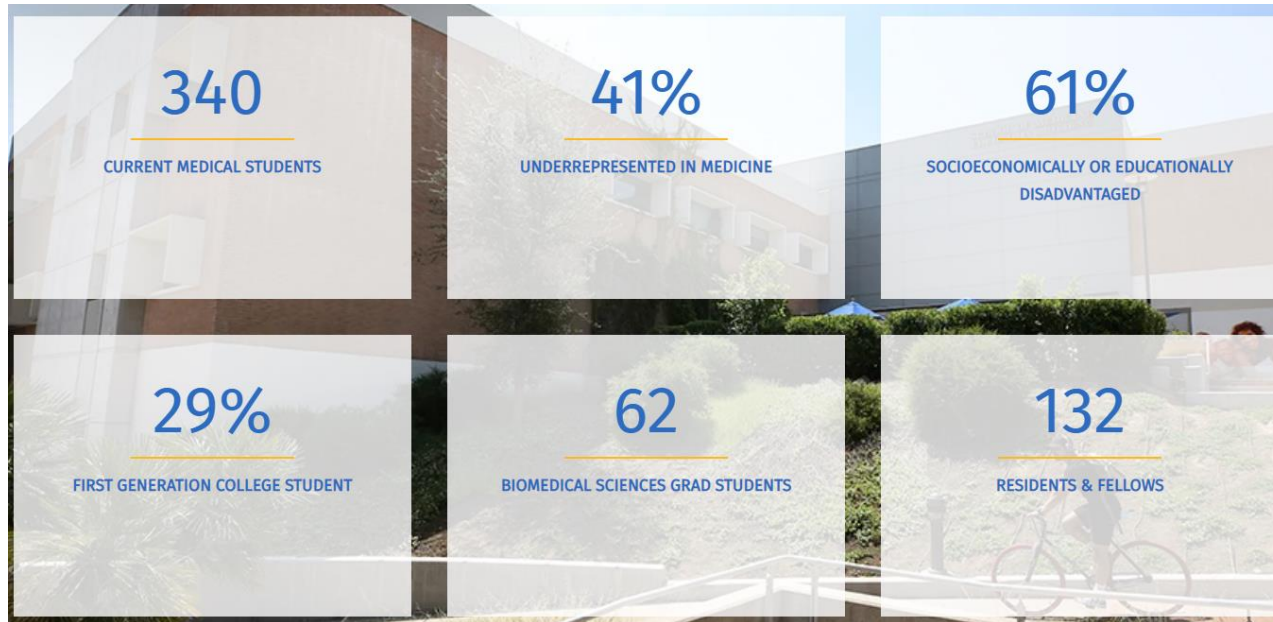
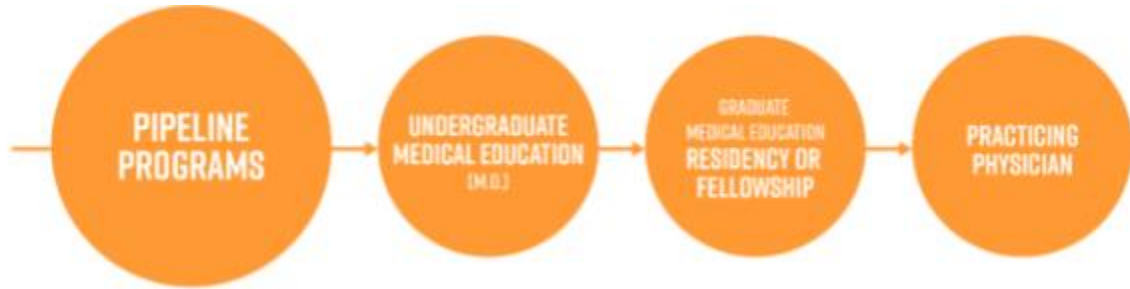
# JMH FM Residency Program Data (2021)

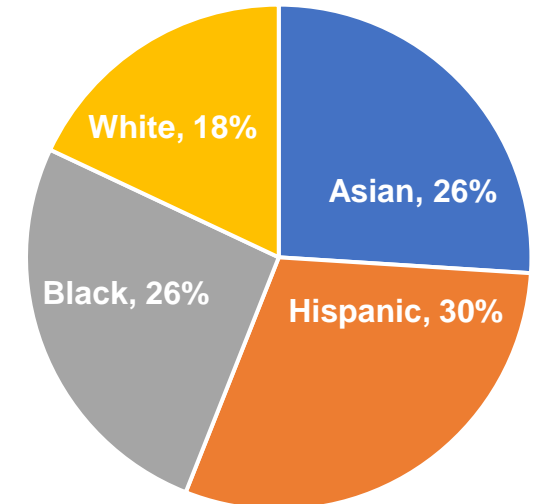

The mission of the UCR School of Medicine is to improve the health of the people of California and, especially, to serve Inland Southern California by training a diverse workforce of physicians and by developing innovative research and health care delivery programs that will improve the health of the medically underserved in the region and become models to be emulated throughout the state and nation.

## Psychiatry Residency Program

- Developed in 2014, a 4-year program offering diverse and eclectic training opportunities in the full breadth of psychiatry, including psychotherapy and pharmacology
- We are community-based, thus we partner with multiple affiliates (county mental health, Veteran's Affairs, children in foster care, Patton state hospital, private hospitals)
- Currently, training 30 residents, with recent approval to expand to 40 residents
- Our Department also has a Child & Adolescent Psychiatry Fellowship Program (est 2017)
- There is ongoing discussions of adding additional fellowship programs that will provide specialized mental health services to the Inland Empire region

## Inland Empire to grow twice as fast as rest of Southern California in next 25 years

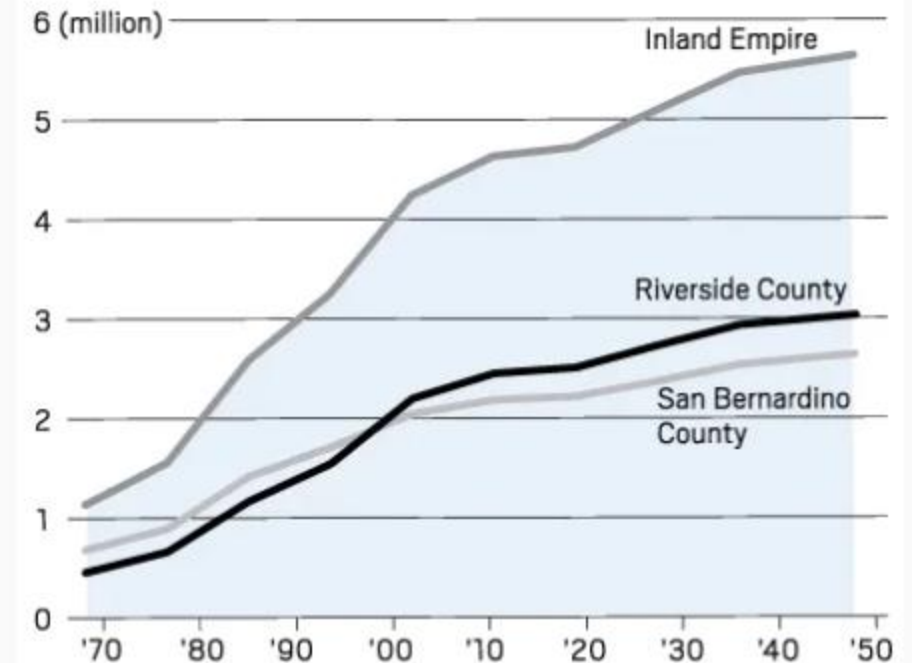
Region expected to grow by more than 20% by 2048
