Agenda Item IV: Hospital Supplier Diversity Reporting Program Update

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Program Overview

Health and Safety Code Section 1339.85-1339.87 requires the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) to develop and administer a Hospital Supplier Diversity Reporting Program to collect and post hospital supplier diversity reports explaining the hospital's supplier diversity statement and procurement efforts regarding certified minority, women, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender (LGBT), and disabled veteran business enterprises.

Hospitals, with operating expenses over a specified amount, are required to annually submit a report to HCAI on their minority, women, LGBT, and disabled veteran business enterprise procurement efforts. HCAI is required to maintain a link on the HCAI website that provides access to the content of hospital supplier diversity reports to the public. The third annual submission of supplier diversity reports was due on July 1, 2023.

All hospital supplier diversity reports are available on the CalHHS Open Data Portal.



Program Recap

Data improvements

- 2021 Revisions submitted for both individual and system reports.
- 2021 Data Summary updated and published.

- Incorrect procurement spend data reported due to typo.
- System procurement spend data submitted as individual hospital spend data.



2022 Data Summary Overview

- This report summarizes data extracted from the third-year Hospital Supplier Diversity reports that were collected for the 2022 report period (1/1/2022 12/31/2022).
- The data summary is separated into two categories:
 - Individual Hospital Reporting: Individual reports are required for each licensed hospital with operating expenses of \$50,000,000 or more, and for hospitals with operating expenses of \$25,000,000 or more that are part of a hospital system.
 - **System Level Reporting:** System level reports are an optional report for hospitals to submit procurement done at a regional network or hospital system level.





Reviewed 371 Individual Hospital reports

- 347 hospitals meet requirements to submit a Hospital Supplier Diversity Report
- 24 hospitals voluntarily submitted a Hospital Supplier Diversity Report



















AB 1392 Updates

AB 1392 Summary

- Signed on October 14, AB 1392 builds on the existing reporting requirements by expanding data collection components and reframing the reports as a plan for increasing procurement from minority, women, LGBT, and disabled veteran businesses that hospitals are required to submit annually a plan.
 - First updated plans are due July 2025
- Authorizes HCAI to undertake outreach and assistance and work with the commission to develop approaches for those activities.
- Directs HCAI, in collaboration with the commission, to develop voluntary guidelines for hospitals to use when conducting their procurement.
- Adds two additional commissioners added to HSDC.
 - One commissioner to represent GPOs and another to be determined by the HCAI director
- Authorizes HCAI to create a supplier/database clearinghouse.

Reporting Impact


Expands the Hospital Supplier Diversity report to include:

- Short- and long-term goals and timetables for increasing procurement from diverse business enterprises.
- Methods in which hospitals resolves any issues that may limit or impede an enterprise from becoming a supplier.
- Information on appropriation contacts for interested business enterprises and description of the procurement process.
- Planned and past implementation of relevant recommendations made by the Hospital Supplier Diversity Commission.

First reports that include this expanded information will be submitted July 1, 2025

Impact to Commission

- Expanded scope and membership.
 - 13 members total
 - Commission to provide input on outreach and assistance, as well as development of voluntary guidelines hospitals can follow to improve procurement efforts.
 - Ongoing review of recommendations to hospitals and HCAI on how to increase procurement with diverse suppliers
- More time commitment starting in 2025.
 - Shifting to regular quarterly meetings in 2025 to support expanded commission scope



Discussion Topic: Identifying Potential Member Organizations

- AB 1392 expands the HSDC by adding two additional members one to represent a group purchasing organization, and the other at the discretion of the HCAI Director.
- What organizations could contribute valuable insights as potential commission members?



Supplier Clearinghouse Database

- HCAI will first focus on building support and capacity for the expanded program.
- Pending funding, HCAI may establish a clearinghouse of diverse certified suppliers.
- Statutory language was modeled after the California Public Utilities Commission's clearinghouse concept.
- Could support hospitals in finding new suppliers.
