### **2025 Program Priorities**



#### **Data Collection**

- Continue to expand the database
- Continue to improve data quality and completeness



#### **Public Reporting**

- Continue executing public reporting priorities: Publish new reports, refresh existing reports with new data
- Expand use of public reports



#### **Data Release**

- Monitor demand; adjust staffing, program policies, and pricing as needed
- Strategically partner with other state agencies



## New HPD Public Reports: Services Report


Consists of 2 dashboards allowing users to explore the types of healthcare services provided to Californians each year.

#### Overview visualization:

- Can be viewed by total number of occurrences, number of people who
  received the service, or utilization rate of the service category per 1,000
  members/year.
- Selecting a specific service category will highlight differences in utilization over time, by geographic region, and across age, sex, or payer type. Payer types are commercial, Medi-Cal, and Medicare.

#### Drill-Down visualization:

- Displays 8 service categories in their relevant subcategories
- View by total number of occurrences, the number of people who received the service at least once, and the utilization rate per 1,000 members per year
  - Additional filters by year, age range, sex, Covered California region, and payer type.
- County Granularity filter allows users to view Los Angeles County's data for the entire county or by one or more of its Service Planning Areas (SPAs).




New HPD Public Reports: Medical Out-of-Pocket

Costs and Chronic Conditions

 Purpose: understanding chronic condition prevalence and medical out-of-pocket cost

- Focuses on 3 metrics: member count, annual median out-of-pocket cost, annual median claim count per member
- Can display the data for the entire state, by county or for specific chronic conditions
- Data can be filtered by county, payer type, and the number of chronic conditions


Launched publicly on December 17, 2024

HPD Data Release Infographic



## **HPD Data Sets:** Following Approval

Once your data request has been approved:

Data applicants will need to sign the Data Request Form and Data Use Agreement (DUA) and pay for their data. The requestor will be invoiced based on the HPD pricing schedule.

Accepted forms of payment are credit card and check. Payment instructions are provided in the data request portal.

# ata Access

Enclave accounts and data access will be granted through the HCAI Secure Data Enclave within 2 weeks of final approval.

Direct transmission instructions will be provided for this method if selected.

# ata Due Date

After a request has been approved, HCAI issues a Data Due Date, upon which the HCAI patient-level data must be destroyed or returned to HCAI.

Data Due Dates can be extended annually, to align with the requestor's CPHS protocol expiration date.

# Request Changes

If there are changes or date extensions requested, requestors must notify HCAI of changes to the project.

# upplemental Requests

If a requestor wishes to make changes to their request such as adding additional data users, or requesting additional years of data, they will submit a Supplemental Request.



### **HPD Data:** Methods of Access

#### **Secure Data Enclave**

- Centralized service for 24/7 remote access to sensitive data.
- Houses the data in a secure environment, protected in accordance with state and federal security and privacy rules, where it can be accessed via a virtual machine launched from the user's computer.
- Comes equipped with a suite of statistical tools and provides scalable computing power to perform analysis on a high volume of data.
- Datasets can only be downloaded from the Enclave after they have been properly de-identified and after HCAI administrator review and approval is granted.

#### **Direct Transmission**

- Direct Transmission is a method where HCAI sends copies of program data outside the secure data enclave directly to an individual or organization.
- Request for Direct Transmission of data will only be provided after a recommendation of approval by the HPD Data Release Committee.

#### **Advisory Committee**


- Advises in formulating program policies regarding data collection, management, use, and access
- Provides input on priorities for public reporting
- Provides a forum for stakeholder and public engagement

#### **Data Release Committee**

- Advises on specific criteria, policies, and procedures for access to non-public data
- Reviews requests to access non-public data
- Considers whether use of the data is consistent with the goals of the program
- Advises the program on privacy and security matters



# Example: DRC Review & Public Meeting Timeline

#### Data Release Committee - Review Process Flow

- Primary reviewers receive assigned materials and review for <u>14 calendar</u> <u>days</u> to identify questions and concerns
- Primary reviewers will have a further 14 calendar days to prepare any documents helpful to present independent recommendations
- All DRC members receive application excerpts <u>14 calendar days</u> in advance of meeting
- HCAI posts agenda 10 calendar days prior to meeting

# During DRC Meeting

- Discuss & resolve concerns about data requests.
- Requestors available to answer questions
- 4 ways to vote:
   <u>RECOMMEND;</u>
   <u>CONDITIONAL; TABLED</u>
   or NOT RECOMMEND.

- HCAI collects recommendations with justification based on committee meeting to create recommendation letter
- Votes documented in committee minutes
- HCAI to notify requestors of final decisions and appropriate next steps
- Once requestor is notified HCAI to notify committee of final determination

#### Considerations for DRC in Making Recommendations

#### Statute requires consideration of:

- Whether and to what extent the data use will contribute to HPD program goals:
  - For all requests, whether the use of the data is "consistent with the goals"
  - For requests that include direct personal identifiers, the bar is higher:
     access may only be provided for research projects that offer
     "significant opportunities to achieve program goals"
- Whether the proposed use of the data provides **greater transparency** regarding health care costs, utilization, quality, or equity
- How the information may be used to inform policy decisions regarding the provision of quality health care, improving public health, reducing health disparities, advancing health coverage, or reducing health care costs

data requests
from other state
agencies

#### **Additional Considerations for DRC Review**



- What are the reasons or justifications provided for all confidential or sensitive data elements requested? These include direct identifiers, indirect identifiers (dates, 5-digit ZIP), and sensitive diagnoses and procedures.
- ☐ How does the request meet minimum data necessary standards?



- What are the risks for commercialization or marketing created by this request? And what is the state's involvement if any?
- What are the risks for anticompetitive use of the data?



- ☐ What are the expected findings/outputs? Will they be made available to policymakers or the public? What level of aggregation will be applied to reports, presentations, and other information products intended for public dissemination?
- ☐ How does the proposed project generate a public benefit for California?
