Our Mission




HCAI expands equitable access to quality, affordable health care for all Californians through resilient facilities, actionable information, and the health workforce each community needs.



HCAI Overview

- Established in 1978 as OSHPD the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development to ensure healthcare accessibility within California
- Transitioned to the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) in 2021 to reflect a growing portfolio and a more descriptive name





Health Workforce Development

Support and increase a health workforce that:

- Serves medically underserved areas.
- Represents the California it serves through racial and language diversity
- Serves Medi-Cal members.

Offer programs that provide financial support for:

- Organizations expanding educational capacity
- Individuals to pursue health careers (scholarship and loan repayment)
- Organizations to build the workforce pipeline





Behavioral Health Scholarship Program (BHSP) Overview

Program Purpose

- To increase the supply of trained behavioral health workforce in California
- \$30 million is available to fund individual scholarships of up to \$25,000
- This program is funded by the Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative, which supports behavioral health professionals to serve children and youth ages 0 through 25 years



BHSP Overview

Reproductive Health Support

- Additional funds are available to support awardees intending to provide services in reproductive health settings
- Completing the application will determine if an applicant qualifies for these funds
- Applicants who are not eligible for Reproductive Health funds may be eligible for BHSP funds

Awards

- Award levels: HCAI may award full, partial, or no funding to an applicant based on the applicant's criteria score and the amount of available funds
- Geographic distribution: Award decisions will depend on application scoring results and geographic coverage across California
- Applicants will be awarded no more than their total cost of attendance for one year of the program
- Within six months of graduation, awardees must begin one year service obligation providing direct client/patient care in a qualified worksite

Application Components

- The application has nine sections:
- General Information
- Profile Information
- 3. Contact Information (one contact required)
- 4. Educational Information
- 5. Professional Information
- 6. Scholarship Program Verification
- 7. Employment History

- 8. Required Documents
 - Ensure you use an acceptable file format, or your application will be rejected! Examples of acceptable formats are .jpg, .doc, .docx, and .pdf.
- 9. Application Certification



Post-Award and Payment Provisions

- HCAI expects the Grantee will begin performance of the grant agreement on the start date listed on the grant award documents.
- The State Controller's Office mails a paper check directly to the Grantee's address on file. Please ensure HCAI has your most recent residential address on file to avoid delay in payment.
- HCAI cannot provide tax advice to Grantees. HCAI are not tax professionals and tax consequences may vary depending on the Grantee. For this reason, Grantees should seek professional tax advice.
- HCAI reserves the right to recover monies for a Grantee's failure to perform service and other grant agreement obligations.



BHSP Evaluation & Application Scoring Procedures

Evaluation and Scoring Procedures

- At the time of application closing, HCAI will review each application for the presence or absence of required information to conform with the application submission requirements
- HCAI may reject applications that contain false or misleading information
- HCAI will use the evaluation criteria described in the Grant Guide to score applications



Scoring Criteria

Core Categories	Guideline	Max Points Possible
Languages Spoken	20 points: Speaks one or more listed languages fluently/well enough to be able to provide direct care services to clients 0 points: Does not speak any of the listed languages	20
Medically Underserved Areas/Populations	Volunteered or worked in a medically underserved area or with medically underserved populations in the United States or overseas 20 points: Yes; 0 points: No	20
Graduation Date	20 points: Graduation date is within calendar year 2024 0 points: Graduation date is later than December 31, 2024	20
Economically Disadvantaged	As defined by the Scholarship for Disadvantaged Students program, identified as having a disadvantaged background based on environmental and/or economic factors, or received a federal Exception Financial Need Scholarship 20 points: Yes; 0 points: No	20
Academic Performance	10 points: Student has a 3.0+ GPA 5 points: Student has a 2.0 - 2.99 GPA or equivalent	10
