- Majority of our students are first generation college students
- CSULB School of Social is one of 24 social work programs in California, and one of 7 in Los Angeles County
 - BASW -150 students (Full-time & part-time programs)



- We serve the Los Angeles community within Los Angeles County.
 - We are in the census designated (SPA) 6 which includes surrounding neighborhoods, South Central Los Angeles, Watts, Willowbrook, and surrounding cities of Compton, Lynwood and South Gate.
 - Principal languages spoken are English, Spanish, and Asian languages.
- The communities we serve are members who come from disadvantaged family backgrounds who are also categorized as underserved, underinsured and unemployed community.
- CDREWU is adjacent to low-income housing such as the Imperial Courts and Jordan Downs Projects.
 - SPA 6 has a high rate of unhoused persons, domestic and gang violence, along with human/sex trafficking.



Education and Training Information 💬



- The type of behavioral health students we educate, and train represent and mirror their communities by coming from various socioeconomic backgrounds, genders, races, ethnicities and speak multiple languages. Where do they come from? CDREWU alumni, and employees from local community clinics and hospitals.
- RNs who originate from vulnerable populations, such as the local community and surrounding cities, as well as 3rd world countries
- Student similarities: Raised in poverty, experienced homelessness and were victims of community related crime and violence. Built resilience and became educated RNs!
- We enroll RNs with a minimum of 1 year of RN experience with a BSN degree and the drive to advance their nursing career by becoming a Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner-Provider role to serve in their community to eliminate the stigma of mental health issues and make a difference with the underserved population. Rolling enrollment, 3 semesters in an executive hybrid learning format.
