# **Organizational Information**

- Riverside City College was established in 1916; serves over 30,000 students annually
- VN program began in 1952; RN program followed in 1957; NATP/CNA began in 2018
- RN program has been nationally accredited since 1983; simulation program, 2020; VN program, 2021
- Over 3500 declared nursing majors
- The SON serves close to 1000 students/year in pre-nursing and nursing classes
- Current NCLEX pass rates: RN 96%, VN 96%
- 100% of RN graduates seeking employment are employed within 1 year
  - 90% are employed in the Inland Empire (Riverside/San Bernardino/Desert)
  - Nearly all are employed in medically underserved areas



- Demographics
- Over 85% of our nursing students report belonging to an URM group
- Over 75% describe themselves as first-generation college students
- Approximately 50% report having already earned a degree
- 54% of students are between the ages of 21-30; 46% are between 31 and 60
- 85% report receiving financial aid
- 68% report having to work during school
- Almost 70% of RN graduates report being enrolled in a BSN program upon graduation



- 3 programs: CNA (with additional stacking certificates for HHA, ACNA), VN, and ADN/RN
- Well established career and academic advancement pathways
  - Traditional 2-year ADN/RN
  - CCAP High School-to-ADN/RN
  - CNA-to-LVN
  - LVN-to-RN
  - Pathway partnerships to BSN: RCC-CSU Concurrent Enrollment Program (CEP), RCC-CBU LVN-to-BSN
  - CNA-to-LVN-to-ADN/RN-to-BSN
- Successful apprenticeship/pre-apprenticeship pathways for newly hired and/or incumbent worker
- RISE UP mentoring and internship program

# **Organizational Information**

- CBU is a private comprehensive Christian university located in, Riverside, California.
- Accreditation from Western Association of Colleges and Schools Senior Colleges and Universities Commission (WSCUC); Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE); and California Board of Registered Nursing (CABRN) program approval.
- A total of 11,496 students attend CBU from 47 states, two U.S. territories and 59 countries, enrolled in 104 bachelor's degree programs, 38 master's degree programs and seven doctoral programs. CBU has a strong commitment to Christ-centered higher education and is known for its vision statement as a "University committed to the Great Commission."
- Most students are commuters and live within the regions of Riverside, San Bernardino, Los Angeles, and Orange County.
- Pre-Nursing is traditionally one of the largest undergraduate enrollment area for incoming freshmen.



- Currently, 780 nursing students are enrolled in the CBUCON.
- Approximately, 565 undergraduates, 182 master's and post-master's, and 33 doctorate students.
- Predominantly a Hispanic serving institution. The Undergraduate program data shows Hispanic, White, Asian and African American; Graduate program data shows Hispanic, Asian, White and African American; and the Doctorate program data shows Hispanic, African American, White, and Asian.
- Pre-licensure nursing students' backgrounds and life experiences include but are not limited to, first generation college student, transfer student, bilingual, military service, previous professional careers, and additional certification in a health care setting, such as EMTs, psychiatric technician, nurses aid, or unit secretary.
- Graduate students are working in the areas of acute care, community health, and nursing leadership. Most graduate students are pursuing an Advanced Practice Registered Nurse (APRN) degree.
