

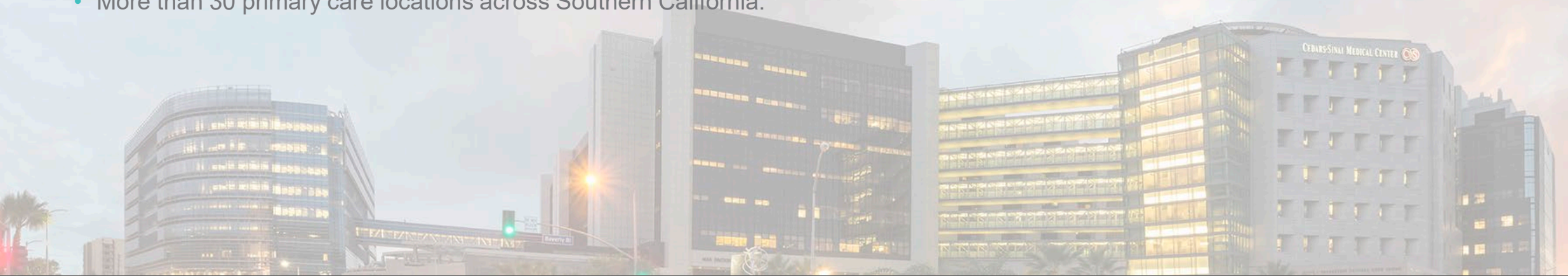

Development of Supplier Diversity Program

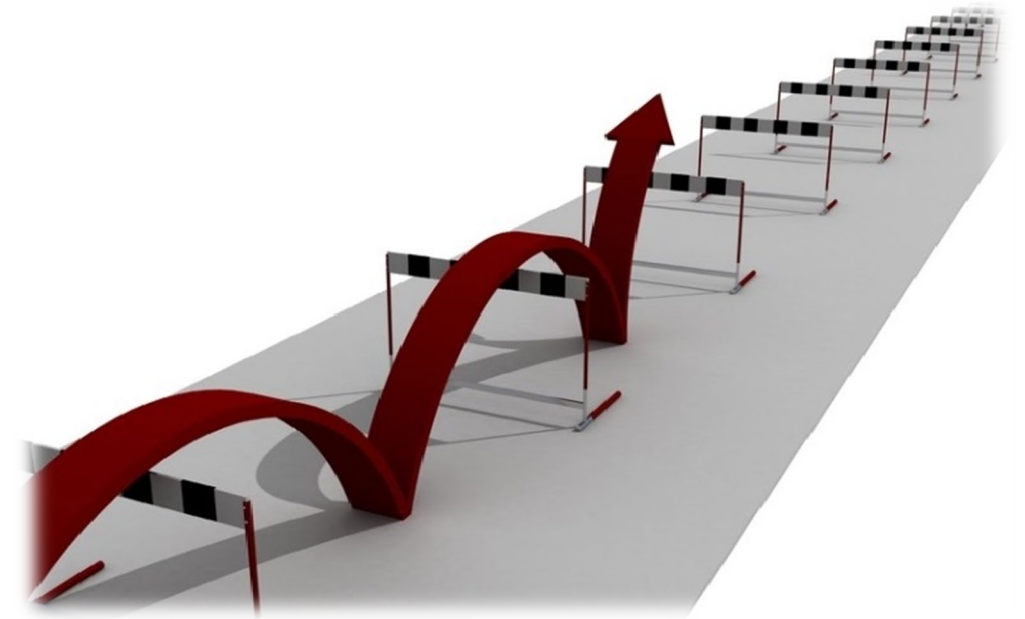
1. Familiarize yourself with the legislative history of supplier diversity in California
2. Solidify partnerships with external business organizations
3. Conduct internal communication
 - a) Provide context surrounding supplier diversity & respective business value it delivers
 - b) Share current state – focus areas
 - c) Share low hanging fruit opportunities – potential big wins - identify main point of contacts for focus areas
 - d) Recruit volunteers



Guidance & suggestions

Working Towards Results

1. Incorporate Supplier Diversity into your sourcing process
 - a) Clearly define process for diverse owned businesses looking to explore procurement opportunities- manage expectations
2. Manage to Budget Constraints
 - a) Partner with other departments
 - b) Leverage volunteers
3. Leverage Network of Community Hospitals
 - a) Hospital Association of Southern California
4. Provide annual refresher training for buyers – outline expectations of support
5. Recognize and highlight supplier diversity ambassadors and big wins
6. Develop a Tier II/Subcontractor Reporting Process
