### **Our Mission**



HCAI expands equitable access to quality, affordable health care for all Californians through resilient facilities, actionable information, and the health workforce each community needs.



### **Health Workforce Development**

#### • Support and increase a health workforce that:

- Serves medically underserved areas
- Represents the California it serves through racial and language diversity
- Serves Medi-Cal members

#### Offer programs that provide financial support for:

- Organizations expanding educational capacity
- Individuals to pursue health careers (scholarship and loan repayment)
- Organizations to build the workforce pipeline

### **Golden State Social Opportunities Overview**

Purpose: To increase the supply of trained behavioral health workforce in California with an emphasis on clinical behavioral health practitioners working in California-based Non-Profit Community Based Organizations (CBOs)

- \$8.8 million is available to fund individual scholarships of up to \$50,000
- Priority will be given to applicants who:
  - Have a history of involvement in foster care
  - Have a history of homelessness
  - Work at a CBO



# **GSSOP Scholarship Program Elements & Key Dates**

### **Eligible Professions**

- Associate or Licensed Clinical Social Worker
- Associate or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist
- Associate or Licensed Professional Clinical Counselor
- Registered Psychological Associate or Licensed Clinical Psychologist



### Awards

- Award levels: HCAI may award full, partial, or no funding to an applicant based on the applicant's criteria score and the amount of available funds
- Geographic distribution: Award decisions will depend on application scoring results and geographic coverage across California
- Applicants will be awarded no more than their total cost of attendance for up to two years of the program
- Awardees are required to provide proof of registration with a clinical licensing board (the Board of Behavioral Sciences or Board of Psychology)
- Within six months of graduation, awardees must begin serving two years of service obligation at a California-based community nonprofit organization

## **GSSOP Grant Application Process**

### **Application Components**

The application has nine sections:

- 1. General Information
- 2. Profile Information
- 3. Contact Information (one contact required)
- 4. Educational Information
- 5. Professional Information
- 6. Scholarship Program Verification
- 7. Employment History

- 8. Required Documents
  - Ensure you use an acceptable file format, or your application will be rejected! Examples of acceptable formats are .jpg, .doc, .docx, and .pdf.
- 9. Application Certification



### **Post-Award and Payment Provisions**

- HCAI expects the Grantee will begin performance of the grant agreement on the start date listed on the grant award documents
- The State Controller's Office mails a paper check directly to the Grantee's address on file. Please ensure HCAI has your most recent residential address on file to avoid delay in payment
- HCAI cannot provide tax advice to Grantees. HCAI are not tax professionals and tax consequences may vary depending on the Grantee. For this reason, Grantees should seek professional tax advice
- HCAI reserves the right to recover monies for a Grantee's failure to perform service and other grant agreement obligations



## **GSSOP Evaluation & Scoring Procedures**

### **Evaluation and Scoring Procedures**

- At the time of application closing, HCAI will review each application for the presence or absence of required information in conformance with the submission requirements
- HCAI may reject applications that contain false or misleading information
- HCAI will use the evaluation criteria described in the Grant Guide to score applications



### **Scoring Criteria**

Core Categories	Guideline	Max Points Possible
Homeless and Foster Youth	Current or former homeless youth 20 points: Yes; 0 points: No Current or former foster youth 20 points: Yes; 0 points: No	40
Community Based Organization	Currently employed at a Community Based Organization 15 points: Yes; 0 points: No	15
Languages Spoken	10 points: Speaks one or more listed languages fluently/well enough to be able to provide direct care services to clients 0 points: Does not speak any of the listed languages	10
Medically Underserved Areas/Populations	Volunteered or worked in a medically underserved area or with medically underserved populations in the United States or overseas? 10 points: Yes; 0 points: No	10
Economically Disadvantaged	As defined by the Scholarship for Disadvantaged Students program, identified as having a disadvantaged background based on environmental and/or economic factors, or received a federal Exception Financial Need Scholarship 10 points: Yes; 0 points: No	10
Academic Performance	10 points: Student has a 3.0+ GPA 5 points: Student has a 2.0 - 2.99 GPA or equivalent	10
