CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH CARE ACCESS AND INFORMATION

The Political Reform Act, Government Code Sections 81000, et seq., requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate Conflict of Interest Codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation, 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730, which contains the terms of a standard Conflict of Interest Code, which can be incorporated by reference in an agency's code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code, which may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 Cal. Code of Regulations Section 18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the Conflict of Interest Code of the Department of Health Care Access and Information (Department).

The Director must file their statement of economic interests electronically with the Fair Political Practices Commission. All other individuals holding designated positions must file their statements with the Department. All statements must be made available for public inspection and reproduction under Government Code Section 81008.

Such written determination shall include a description of the consultant/new position's duties and, based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. The Director's or their designee's determination is a public record and shall be retained for public inspection in the same manner and location as this Conflict of Interest Code. (Gov. APPENDIX B

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

1. Designated employees in Category 1 must disclose:

All interests in real property in the State of California, as well as investments, business positions and sources of income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments.

2. Designated employees in Category 2 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that are subject to the regulatory authority or program or project approval of, or that have an application for program or project approval pending before, the Healthcare Workforce Development Division¹.

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments or income from a nonprofit organization, if the source is of the type to receive grants or other monies from or through the Healthcare Workforce Development Division.

3. Designated employees in Category 3 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources of the type that are subject to the regulatory authority of the Information Services Division², including but not limited to health facilities and clinics and manufacturers of prescription drugs for humans.

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from sources that, on behalf of health facilities or clinics, prepare mandated reports to the Information Services Division.

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from vendors of software that are subject to Department approval for reporting of annual health facility financial data to the Information Services Division.

4. Designated employees in Category 4 must disclose:

All interests in real property in the State of California, as well as investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources of the type that engage in

the management, design, construction, construction review, or financing of, health facilities of the type subject to plan and construction review and approval by the Office of Statewide Hospital Planning and Development.

5. Designated employees in Category 5 must disclose:

All interests in real property in the State of California, as well as investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, or income from a nonprofit organization, from sources of the type that are engaged in the management, design, construction, or financing of health facilities (as defined in Health and Safety Code Section 129010) in California.

6. Designated employees in Category 6 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans and travel payments, from health care entities, including payers, providers, and fully integrated delivery systems, (as defined in Health and Safety Code Section 127500.2), purchasers (as defined in Health and Safety Code Section 127500.2), pharmaceutical companies, retail pharmacies, pharmacy benefit managers, and ambulance companies.

7. Designated employees in Category 7 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that provide leased facilities, goods, equipment, vehicles, machinery or services, including training or consulting services, of the type utilized by the Department.

8. Designated employees in Category 8 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that manufacture, distribute, supply, or install computer hardware or software, or provide computer consultant or training services for the Department.

9. Designated employees in Category 9 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources of the type that are or could be required or requested to report information to the Department under the Health Care Payments Data Program (Health and Safety Code Section 127671 et seq.).

10. Designated employees in Category 10 must disclose:

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that collect, sell, or otherwise disseminate health information for the business operations of itself or others.

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that perform health care data analytics and consulting.

All investments, business positions and income, including gifts, loans, and travel payments, from sources that conduct or fund health care research.
