- The HEDIS measures selected for stratification beginning in MY2022:
 1. Colorectal Cancer Screening
 2. Controlling High Blood Pressure
 3. Hemoglobin A1c Control for Patients with Diabetes
 4. Prenatal and Postpartum Care
 5. Child and Adolescent Well Care Visits

 1. Immunizations for Adolescents (IMA)
 2. Breast Cancer Screening (BCS-E)
 3. Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E)
 4. Asthma Medication Ratio (AMR)
 5. Follow-Up After Emergency Department Visit for Substance Use (FUA)
 6. Pharmacotherapy for Opioid Use Disorder (POD)
 7. Initiation and Engagement of Substance Use Disorder Treatment (IET)
 8. Well-Child Visits in the First 30 Months of Life (W30)
- **Social Need Screening and Intervention (SNS-E).** To encourage health plans to assess and address the food, housing and transportation needs of their patient populations, this measure helps health plans identify specific needs and connect members with resources necessary to address unmet social needs. This

measure assesses members who were screened, using prespecified instruments, at least once during the measurement period for unmet food, housing, and transportation needs, and who received a corresponding intervention if they screened positive.
