

Health Workforce Pilot Projects Program Overview

BACKGROUND

- The Health Manpower Pilot Project (HMPP) (Renamed the Health Workforce Pilots Project (HWPP) in 2007), was established in 1972 within the California Department of Health.
- Administered by the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development/Department of Health Care Access and Information since 1978.
- Governed by the following regulatory authorities:
 - California Health and Safety Code Sections 128125-128195
 - California Code of Regulations Section 92001-92702



PURPOSE

Allows organizations to study the potential expansion of a provider's scope of practice to:

- Facilitate better access to health care.
- Expand and encourage workforce development.
- Demonstrate, test, and evaluate new or expanded roles for healthcare professionals or new healthcare delivery alternatives.
- Inform the Legislature when considering changes to existing legislation in the Business and Professions Code.



ELIGIBILITY

- Sponsoring entity must be non-profit education institution, community hospital, clinic, or a government agency engaged in health or education activities.
- The project must include at least one of the following:
 - Teach new skills to existing categories of health care personnel.
 - Develop new categories of health care personnel.
 - Accelerate the training of existing categories of health care personnel.
 - Teach new health care roles to previously untrained persons.




APPLICATION ELEMENTS


- The project sponsor should identify the following in preparation for compiling an <u>application</u>:
 - Targeted health care occupation
 - Institution where training is conducted
 - Preparation of curriculum including didactic and clinical components
 - Project sites for employment and implementation
 - Partner agencies
 - Source of funding
 - Proposed budget
 - Timeline



APPLICATION REVIEW PROCESS











Hearing Process (when required)

Mail 30-Day Hearing Notice to Interested Parties	
Hold Public Hearing on the Application	
Release Public Hearing Transcript within 60-Days to Interested Parties	
Receive Feedback from Public Hearing	
HCAI Staff Submits Recommendations to HCAI Director
