BH-CONNECT Cycle Review Key Takeaways

- The launch of the Medi-Cal Behavioral Health Loan Repayment Program marked a major milestone.
- The cycle review provides insights on application trends, including scoring results, geographic distribution, and languages spoken.
- Findings help assess progress toward goals, highlight successes, and identify areas for improvement.



BH and the Aging Population Key Takeaways

- California's aging and diversifying population is driving higher demand for behavioral health care.
- Workforce shortages and limited geriatric training hinder access to needed services.
- Informal and paraprofessionals caregivers face low wages, burnout, and limited formal training.
- Expanding training, integrating behavioral health into aging services, investing in data infrastructure, and supporting caregivers are key opportunities for policy action.
