AB 1577 Background

- Signed into law in 2024¹, AB 1577 aims to address the shortage of clinical training slots available to nursing students in California Community Colleges (CCC) and California State Universities (CSU).
- Requires HCAI to collect and publish written justifications from health facilities² and clinics³ that are unable to accommodate clinical placement requests from CCC or CSU nursing programs.
- Facilities and clinics that fail to submit the required form by the annual deadline may face an administrative penalty of up to \$1,000.



Purpose

- AB 1577 supports the long-term goal of addressing California's nursing workforce needs by identifying barriers that prevent health facilities and clinics from accommodating nursing programs and students. Clinical placement is a significant barrier to nursing growth expansion.
- Increases transparency and accountability in clinical placement decisions to help expand training opportunities.
- Promotes collaboration between CSU and CCC nursing programs and clinical sites across the state.
 - Focuses on public institutions to support affordability, community alignment, and improved access through California's public higher education system.



Key Requirements

- Beginning January 1, 2025, health facilities and clinics must meet with CCC or CSU nursing programs upon request to discuss clinical placement needs.
- If unable to offer additional placements, facilities and clinics must submit a written justification to HCAI by January 30, 2026, and annually each January 30 thereafter, covering the prior calendar year.
 - Justifications must explain the reason for declining placements. Acceptable reasons may include:
 - Lack of relevant services, insufficient patient census, staffing shortages, disagreements
 over affiliation agreement terms, shift scheduling preferences, and/or other specified
 reasons.
- Failure to submit the required form by the deadline may result in an administrative penalty of up to \$1,000.
- Submitted justifications will be posted on HCAI's website for five years.



Stakeholder Engagement

- In the coming weeks, HCAI staff will meet with individual stakeholders to share program
 details, answer questions, and gather input on the implementation process.
- Stakeholders will include:
 - Health facility associations
 - Clinic associations
 - Nursing associations
 - CSU nursing programs
 - CCC nursing programs
- Engagement will occur through virtual meetings, targeted outreach, and follow-up discussions to ensure broad participation and meaningful feedback.



Next Steps and Implementation

- Meet with stakeholders to share information and gather input.
- Develop a standardized form on HCAI's website for submitting written justifications.
- Establish clear procedures for reviewing submissions and applying penalties for non-compliance.
- Collect and publish data on clinical placement availability and justifications to support transparency and future decisionmaking.
