 - Song-Brown Residences



HCAI Updates: Health Care Affordability Spending Target

The California Health Care Affordability Board established a base 3% spending target, based on the average annual rate of change in historical median household income from 2002-2022, for performance year 2029, and added 0.5% to the 3% base for performance year 2025 and 2026, and 0.2% to the 3% base in performance year 2027 and 2028.
