HCAI - Department of Health Care Access and Information

Office of Statewide Hospital Planning and Development Building Safety – HCAI

- 1. Promulgate regulations in Title 24 for Hospitals, Skilled Nursing Facilities, Acute Psychiatric Hospitals
- 2. HCAI is the building department for these facilities
- 3. Promulgate OSHPD 3 CLINIC regulations in Title 24, Chapter 12, Section 1226
- 4. HCAI has authority to make or modify regulations (building standards) for health care facilities licensed by CDPH, including Primary Care Clinics.
- 5. Coordinate with CDPH (licensing), CPCA, oSFM (Fire and Life Safety) and DSA (Access)

What is OSHPD 3?

Title 24 contains the minimum building standards (regulations) for the construction and alteration of buildings and structures in CA . Title 24 is comprised of building, fire, electrical, mechanical, plumbing regulations, energy and sustainable, etc.

HCAI/OSHPD amend Title 24 (Section 1226.6 - [OSHPD 3] CLINICS) for PCCs listed in HSC 1204(a)

CDPH responsible for licensing PCCs and they promulgate Title 22 regulations (points to Title 24 for building standards)

1226.1 Scope. The provisions of this section shall apply to primary care clinics, specialty clinics and psychology clinics, licensed by the California Department of Public Health. Primary care clinics include free clinics, community clinics, employee clinics and optometric clinics. Specialty clinics include surgical clinics, chronic dialysis clinics, rehabilitation clinics and alternative birth centers (ABC). This section shall also apply to outpatient clinical services of a hospital when provided in a freestanding building.

1226.4 General construction. Clinics and outpatient clinical services under a hospital license shall comply with the provisions under Section 1224.4, General Construction, where applicable, except as supplemented, amended or modified below.

OUTPATIENT CLINICAL SERVICES OF A HOSPITAL

1226.5 OUTPATIENT CLINICAL SERVICES OF A HOSPITAL. A licensed hospital may elect to locate certain outpatient services in a freestanding building. To be considered a freestanding building, refer to the California Administrative Code Section 7-111. See Section 309A.5.1 of the California Existing Building Code for eligibility for jurisdiction of the local enforcement agency over freestanding buildings adjacent to hospital buildings.

Outpatient clinical services of a hospital provided in a freestanding building are regulated under the banner [OSHPD 3] instead of [OSHPD 1]. These services shall comply with Sections 1226.4.2 through 1226.4.8 and the provisions of this section. Outpatient clinical services of a hospital that are not addressed in the provisions of Section 1226 shall comply with applicable provisions of Section 1224 and/or Section 1228 as if those provisions were repeated in Section 1226.5.



PRIMARY CARE CLINICS

1226.6 PRIMARY CARE CLINICS. Primary care clinics and outpatient clinical services of a hospital providing services equivalent to a primary care clinic shall comply with Sections 1226.4.3 through 1226.4.8 and the provisions of this section.

SURGICAL CLINICS

1226.8 SURGICAL CLINICS. Outpatient surgical clinics, and outpatient clinical services of a hospital providing services equivalent to a surgical clinic, shall comply with Sections 1226.4.2 through 1226.4.8 and the provisions of this section.



Mechanical and Plumbing Code Requirements

Mechanical Code items in research for 2025 Intervening Code

- Reduced Filtration for lower acuity functions in clinics
- Possible use of plenums for low acuity spaces

Plumbing Code items in research for 2025 Intervening Code

- Fixture counts for toilet facilities
- Shared staff toilet for 5 or less staff

Electrical Code Requirements

California Electrical Code, Part 3 of Title 24 of the California Code of Regulations

Standard GFCI protection required

Patient care ground fault current path required - metallic raceway and ground wire

Lighting intensity shall meet ANSI/IES RP-29 <u>Recommended Practice for Lighting in Hospitals</u> and Healthcare Facilities

Mobile medical facilities and X-ray circuiting requirements included. (nothing exceptional)

Nurse call systems per Table 1224.4.6.5 shall be required if imaging exam/procedure rooms are present



CEC 210.8(B)

Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupter Protection for Personnel

210.8 Ground-Fault Circuit-Interrupter Protection for Personnel. Ground-fault circuit-interruption for personnel shall be provided as required in 210.8(A) through (C). The ground-fault circuit-interrupter shall be installed in a readily accessible location.

....

- (B) Other Than Dwelling Units. All 125-volt, single-phase,15- and 20-ampere receptacles installed in the locations specified in 2 I0.8(B)(I) through (8) shall have ground-fault circuit-interrupter protection for personnel.
- (1) Bathrooms
- (2) Kitchens
- (3) Rooftops
- (4) Outdoors
- (5) Sinks where receptacles are installed within 1.8 m (6ft) of the outside edge of the sink.
- (6) Indoor wet locations
- (7) Locker rooms with associated showering facilities

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Part I - General (definitions)*

<u>Patient Care Area - Where patients are intended to be examined or treated.</u>

Category 3 (Basic Care) Space.

- Typically, where basic medical or dental care, treatment, or examinations are performed. Examples
 include, but are not limited to, examination or treatment rooms in clinics, medical and dental offices,
 nursing homes, and limited care facilities
- Space in which failure of equipment or a system is <u>not likely to cause injury</u> to the patients, staff, or visitors but can cause patient discomfort.

Category 2 (General Care) Space.

- Patient beds, exam rooms, treatment rooms, etc., where patients will come in contact with ordinary appliances.
- Space in which Failure of equipment or a system is likely to cause <u>minor injury</u> to patient, staff, or visitors.

Part II - Wiring and Protection

Grounding requirements of receptacles and fixed equipment in <u>Patient</u> <u>Care Areas</u>

- Wiring method In metal raceway system or cable having metallic armor or sheath assembly that qualifies as an equipment grounding conductor in accordance with 250.118 [517.13(A)]
 - -and-
- Insulated copper grounding conductor connected to ground terminals of all receptacles, metal junction boxes and fixed equipment. [517.13(B)]



517.22 [OSHPD 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5] Artificial Lighting.

(A) Rooms and Passageways. All rooms and passageways shall be provided with artificial illumination.

(B) Illumination.

(1) [OSHPD 1, 3, 4 & 5] Illumination intensity. Illumination intensity values in each area shall meet the recommended values in the latest edition of ANSI/IES RP-29, Recommended Practice: Lighting Hospital and Healthcare Facilities.

- No exceptional requirements

- August email draft regulations to interested parties
- August second PCC public meeting

OSHPD 3 Clinics

The Department of Health Care Access and Information is responsible for writing regulations pertaining to licensed clinics. These regulations are identified in the California Building Standards Code as "OSHPD 3". OSHPD 3 requirements for clinics shall only be applied to clinics that are licensed pursuant to Health and Safety Code (H&S) Section 1200 (which includes primary care clinics and specialty clinics) or outpatient services of a hospital licensed pursuant to H&S Section 1250.

The following documents are intended to assist designers, building officials, and clinic operators in applying OSHPD 3 requirements and determining which jurisdiction has authority over the plan review, certification, and construction inspection of clinic facilities.
