# Agenda

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## The HCAiVision

Every Californian should have access to equitable, affordable, quality health care provided in a safe environment by a diverse workforce — guided by objective health information that improves outcomes for all.

# Psychiatric Education Capacity Expansion (PECE) Psychiatry Residency Program

## Program Goals

- Increase the number of underrepresented individuals in health professions training and practice.
- Support cultural and linguistic diversity.
- Create more equitable workforce geographic distribution.

## Description of services

- Funding organizations to train:
  - Psychiatry residents.
  - Child and adolescent psychiatry fellows.
  - Addiction psychiatry fellows.

# PECE Grant Program Purpose

- To increase the supply of psychiatrists and psychiatric mental health nurse practitioners (PMHNPs) trained to work in California.

# PECE Guiding Principles

- Provide care that is client-centered for adults with or at risk of serious mental illness, with priority on early intervention.
- Provide care that is child- and youth-centered, with priority on early intervention.
- Ensure racial diversity, cultural humility, and a linguistically competent workforce.
- Conduct outreach to and engagement with the unserved, underserved, and inappropriately served.
- Use effective, innovative, evidence-based, and community-identified practices.



# PECE Guiding Principles

*(continued)*

- Promote wellness, recovery, resilience, positive behavioral health, and other outcomes among children and youth and their families.
- Include the viewpoints and expertise of persons with lived experience.
- Work collaboratively to deliver individualized, strengths-based, consumer- and family-driven services.
- Promote inter-professional care by working across disciplines.
- HCAI expects these guiding principles to be used by grantees to inform their educational materials and training.

# Grant Program Funding

- Funding is available to fund both psychiatry residency and PMHNP programs.
- The allocation of funds to each discipline will depend on application evaluation scores and geographic coverage across California.

# Use of Grant Funds for Psychiatry Residency

- **New Programs:** Funding to obtain accreditation by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).
- **Program Expansion:** First year of activity focused on obtaining ACGME permanent approval of additional slots, developing the expanded program, and recruiting faculty, rotation sites, and residents.

# Grant Program: New Programs

- The grant period for grantees to secure ACGME accreditation is **three years**.
- Funding is for grantees to obtain ACGME by **June 30, 2025**.
- HCAI will release grant funds in three payments:
  - 25% when grant agreements are executed.
  - 25% when select phases of work are completed (see grant guide).
  - Balance of funds for allowable expenses when HCAI receives:
    - Proof all required work is complete
    - Final Program Report

# Grant Program: Program Expansion

- The grant period for Psychiatry Residency Program Expansion is **five years**.
- The first year of the grant may be dedicated to developing program expansion, hiring faculty, securing additional rotations, and recruiting new psychiatry residents.
- Funds will be paid annually for expenses incurred.
- ACGME approval is required before any funds are released.

# Grant Program Awards

- **Non-supplantation:** Grants must be used to supplement existing funds and not to replace funds the grantee has received from another source for the same purpose.
- **Administrative/indirect costs:** Grant funds cannot be used for administrative or indirect costs. These costs are built into the grant award.
- **Award levels:** HCAI may award full, partial, or no funding to an applicant based on the applicant's evaluation score and the amount of available funds.

# Grant Application Requirements

- List current and/or proposed field placement sites.
- Submit a letter of sustainability committing the sponsoring organization to support new or additional training slots when HCAI grant ends.

# Grant Application Budget

- New Psychiatry Residency Programs:
  - Eligible programs may receive an award up to \$2,500,000.
- Expansion of existing Psychiatry Residency Programs:
  - Eligible programs may receive \$175,000 per filled first year new positions.

# Grant Application Evaluation Criteria

Evaluation criteria include the following themes:

- Percent of patients served who primarily speak Medi-Cal threshold languages.
- Proportion of children and adolescents served by agencies which residents do rotations.
- Cultural competency and resident recruitment strategies.
- Payor Mix (Medi-Cal, Medi-Cal/Medicare, and Uninsured Payers).
- HPSA Mental Health Score based on location of rotation sites.
- Geography: HCAI also intends to support a geographic distribution across California.

# Annual Program Reports

Report on student outcomes

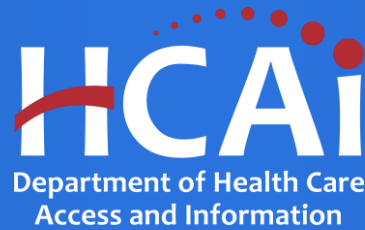
- Program Reports required to receive payments.
- Reports are due July 31 of each grant year.
- Grantees will report on the numbers of applicants and admitted residents, and those interested in serving underserved communities.
- Use of PECE guiding principles in training materials and training.
- How HCAI funds support specific residents or are used for the entire cohort's training.
