First SIERA Report Submissions are Days Away!

OSHPD is eagerly anticipating the first ED/AS report submissions in SIERA. SIERA will open for ED and AS January through March 2021 file submissions at the beginning of April.

New SIERA features

The Facility Administrator (FA) will no longer be required to have a user account. If the FA wishes to have access to reports and data submissions, the User Account Administrator can create a user account. FAs have the ability to opt-out of routine report status emails. However, FAs will continue to receive designated program essential communications.

For your convenience, your Home page displays the assigned OSHPD analyst for each facility.

Quick reminders

The chart below displays which report periods you will submit in each system. Inpatient July through December 2020 will still be submitted in MIRCal.

New 2021 Edits

Below are new edit flags that will apply to 2021 data submissions:

Abstract Record Number = SSN (IP/ED/AS)

If an Abstract Record Number matches the Social Security Number, data will either fail transmittal or receive the S146 flag:

- Manually entered records will display Standard Edit Flag S146
- File submissions will fail Transmittal Validation

Trend Warnings (TW) (ED/AS)

The following Trend warnings have been added for Race and Total Charges:

Race

- TW18 Race decreased more than 20%
- TW19 Race increased more than 20%
- TW20 Total number of records with multiple races reported decreased more than 20%
- TW21 Total number of records with multiple races reported increased more than 20%
- TW22 Ethnicity decreased more than 20%
- TW23 Ethnicity increased more than 20%
- TW24 Ethnicity-Race decreased more than 20%
- TW25 Ethnicity-Race increased more than 20%

Total Charges

- TW16 Average Total Charges decreased more than 20%
- TW17 Average Total Charges increased more than 20%

Although Warning (non-Critical) Trend flags are not applied towards the Error Tolerance Level, facilities should always review TW flags for potential errors in reporting. **D** Emergency Department



SIERA Terminology

In SIERA, data submissions and edit programs will function in a very similar way to MIRCal. However, some of the terminology you are used to seeing in MIRCal may be a little different in SIERA. Below is a reference chart detailing some of the basic differences.

Point of Origin – "G"

The National Uniform Billing Committee released <u>guidance</u> that a new Point of Origin Code is being added, Point of Origin Code G --Transfer from a Designated Disaster Alternate Care Site. Code G may be used for discharges on or after July 1, 2020.

Use of the new code, "G" is encouraged when appropriate for discharges on and after July 1, 2020. OSHPD has added this code to the patient data reporting system and resources while work is done to formally adopt the use of this code via the rulemaking process. Additionally, Code G has been added to the <u>Source of Admission</u> section of the Inpatient Data Reporting Manual, and OSHPD has published an <u>FAQ</u> on the Patient Level Administrative Data page. The FAQ contains valuable information, including the definition of a Designated Disaster Alternate Care Site.
