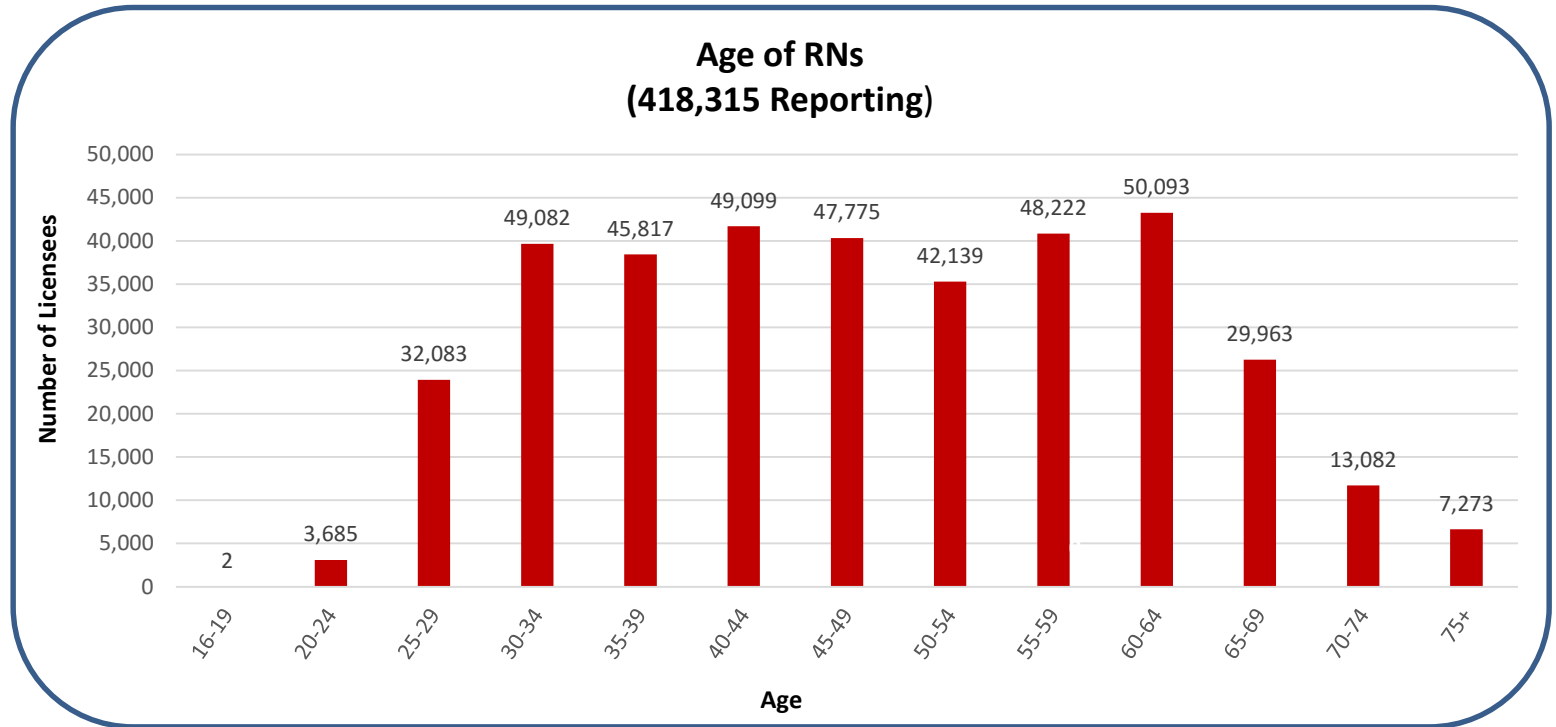




REGISTERED NURSES

As of October 2016, the California Board of Registered Nurses reported 418,315 active Registered Nurses (RN). The average age of RNs was 48 years old.

REGISTERED NURSES

Most RNs work in acute care hospitals, but some care for patients in private clinics or work in private homes. They evaluate patients' health problems and needs and provide nursing care to ill, injured, convalescing, and/or disabled patients. RNs record patients' medical histories and symptoms, and administer treatment and medications. They help perform diagnostic tests, analyze results, and may advise patients on health maintenance and disease prevention. RNs develop and apply nursing care plans and maintain medical records. They educate patients and the public about various medical conditions. They also assist with patient follow-up and rehabilitation and provide advice and emotional support to the patients' family members.
