Are you familiar with the testing, observation and inspection form? Are you new to Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development (OSHPD) projects or a seasoned veteran working with the TIO form but need a refresher on the newly implemented changes to the form? Please join OSHPD's Inspection Services Unit (ISU) in this brief overview of the form and the significant changes to it.

Every three years, California adopts a new set of building codes. The 2019 California Building Standards Code (CBSC), California Code of Regulations, Title 24, was published in July 2019 and became effective January 1, 2020. That means all building permit applications submitted on or after January 1 must be compliant with the 2019 code. Changes to the code are significant and broad in scope. Design professionals, inspectors of record and all others involved with the TIO form should not miss this informational webinar.

The ISU team at OSHPD will outline important changes, including energy requirements, to the CBSC and explain what hospitals, design professionals, and their construction teams should consider to achieve compliance.
