


LICENSED VOCATIONAL NURSES

As of July 2016, the California Board of Vocational Nurses and Psychiatric Technicians reported 98,808 active Licensed Vocational Nurses (LVN). The average age of LVNs was 57 years old.

LICENSED VOCATIONAL NURSES

LVNs provide basic, bedside nursing care for sick, injured, convalescing, elderly, and physically or mentally disabled persons. They typically work in a health care team under the direction and supervision of a physician or registered nurse and develop their skills in medical-surgical, maternity, and pediatric nursing. LVNs observe patients, perform basic assessments, and report and document changes in a patient's condition. They also measure vital signs, perform medical treatments, and administer prescribed medications. LVNs may collect samples and perform routine laboratory tests, feed patients, and record food and fluid intake and output. Some help deliver, care for, and feed newborn babies. Some LVNs perform intravenous therapy or blood withdrawal.
