WET PECE Grant Program Purpose

To increase the supply of psychiatrists and public mental health nurse practitioners (PMHNPs) trained to work in the local public mental health system (PMHS).



The Public Mental Health System (PMHS)

- Publicly funded mental health programs/ services and entities administered, in whole or in part, by state departments or counties.
- Entities may include public and/or community-based organizations and institutions.
- It *does not* include programs and/or services administered, in whole or in part by federal, state, county, or private correctional entities or programs, or services provided in correctional facilities.

Grant Program Elements: Funding

- Up to \$18 million is available to fund both psychiatry residency and PMHNP training programs.
- Allocation of funds to each discipline depends on application evaluation results and geographic coverage across California.



Grant Program Elements: Awards

• OSHPD may award full, partial, or no funding to an applicant based on the applicant's criteria score and the amount of available funds.



Grant Program Elements: Use of Funds

- New Programs: funds are intended to be used to obtain national accreditation and state approval.
- Program Expansion: funds are intended to support operational costs associated with the admission of additional residents, with first year of activity developing expanded program and recruiting faculty and field placement sites.
- Grantees may not use OSHPD funds to supplant funds the grantee has received from another source for the same purpose.



Grant Program Elements: New Programs

- The grant period for New PMHNP Programs is three years.
- Funding is for entities establishing new programs that can receive national accreditation and state approval by June 30, 2023.
- OSHPD will require proof of national accreditation and state approval of the new PMHNP program and receipt of the final Program Report as conditions for releasing grant funds.



Grant Program Elements: Program Expansion

- The grant period for PMHNP Program Expansion is five years.
- The first year of the grant may be dedicated to developing the expansion, including but not limited to securing accreditation and approval, securing faculty, and recruiting new students.

- Applicants seeking support for both psychiatry residents and child and adolescent fellows use a single application.



Grant Application Requirements

- Current and/or proposed field placement sites, noting which are county- or state-designated PMHS settings.
- A letter of sustainability committing the sponsoring organization to support new or additional training slots when OSHPD grant ends.



Grant Application Budget: Administrative Expenses

- There is no administrative cap.
- Applicants will describe administrative expenses in the application.

Application Evaluation Criteria

- Average cost per new student (OSHPD calculated)
- Percent of field placements in the PMHS
- Percent of field placements in rural areas (OSHPD calculated)
- New program
- Preceptor arrangements secured (PMHNP Program Expansion)
- Geography: OSHPD also intends to support a geographic distribution across California.



Annual Program Reports

- Required annually to receive ongoing funding.
- Elements
 - Information about the numbers of applicants and admitted student, and those interested in serving the underserved in the PMHS.
 - Use of Mental Health Services Act values and principles in training materials, and training in the PMHS.
 - Do OSHPD funds support specific students or are the funds used for the entire cohort's training.
