

## **Health Care Payments Data Program**

Assembly Bill 80 (AB 80) (Chapter 12, Statutes of 2020) requires the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI) to create and administer a statewide Health Care Payments Data (HPD) system and have the database substantially complete by July 1, 2023.

HCAI is required to adopt emergency regulations to implement HPD by December 31, 2021. Those regulations have been approved by the Office of Administrative Law and are effective as of December 20, 2021.

AB 80 provides authorization for health plans and insurers to send protected health information to HCAI. Per AB 80, HCAI convened an advisory committee to advise HCAI on the establishment, implementation, sustainability, and ongoing administration of the database. The bill also includes provisions regarding:

- 1. Mandatory and voluntary data submitters
- 2. Enforcement mechanisms necessary for these entities to comply
- 3. Protections for individual privacy and confidentiality of the data
- 4. Establishment of a governance structure
- 5. Recommendations for how existing public health data functions may be integrated into the system.

The list of upcoming activities below outlines the activities HCAI will take to meet the requirements of AB 80 and substantially complete the database by July 1, 2023.
