

OSHPD IMPROVED HEALTH CARE ACCESS BY AWARDING \$52.9 MILLION IN WORKFORCE GRANTS IN 2020

In 2020 the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development provided nearly \$53 million in grant funding to help expand access to primary and mental health care for Californians most in need.

WORKFORCE EDUCATION AND TRAINING PROGRAM (WET)

The program is part of the Mental Health Services Act to address the shortage of mental health practitioners in the public mental health system.
