Dr. Roger Liu serves as the Director of Medical Education for the Institute for Health Equity at AltaMed Health Services, the largest independent Federally Qualified Health Center network in the nation. In this role, he oversees all educational programming and curriculum development including Undergraduate Medical Education pre-health pipeline programs, Graduate Medical Education residency and fellowship training programs and Continuing Medical Education. Dr. Liu oversees numerous grant-funded programs including the Health Careers Opportunity Program, National Medical Fellowships-Primary Care Leadership Program, Adverse Childhood Experiences, Advanced Nursing Education Workforce, Nursing Workforce Diversity and Primary Care Training Enhancement. Dr. Liu was a professor in the Department of Family Medicine at the University of California (UC) Irvine School of Medicine, where he served as Director of the Program for Medical Education for the Latino Community Family Medicine Residency Track. In addition, Dr. Liu was a director and researcher in the Departments of Molecular and Cell Biology and Integrative Biology at UC Berkeley. For over 25 years, Dr. Liu has been dedicated to diversity, equity, and training the next generation of healthcare providers committed to serving multi-ethnic underserved communities. Dr. Liu earned a Ph.D., Integrative Biology-Comparative Endocrinology, and a B.A., Integrative Biology from UC Berkeley.
