



## NOTIFICATION OF PROPOSED EMERGENCY REGULATORY ACTION February 12, 2024

## HEALTH CARE SPENDING TARGETS; TOTAL HEALTH CARE EXPENDITURES (THCE) DATA COLLECTION

To All Interested Parties:

Government Code section 11346.1 (a)(2) requires that, at least five (5) working days prior to submission of the proposed emergency action to the Office of Administrative Law (OAL), an adopting agency provide a notice of the proposed emergency action to every person who has filed a request for notice of regulatory action with the agency. After submission of the proposed emergency to OAL, OAL shall allow interested persons five (5) calendar days to submit comments on the proposed emergency regulations as set forth in Government Code section 11349.6.

Upon filing, OAL will have ten (10) calendar days within which to review and make a decision on the proposed emergency action. If approved, OAL will file the regulations with the Secretary of State, and **the emergency regulations will become effective for five years, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 127501.2**. During the period in which the regulations are effective as emergency regulations, the Department of Health Care Access and Information (HCAI), Office of Health Care Affordability (OHCA) (collectively HCAI-OHCA) will proceed with a regular rulemaking action, including a public comment period. The emergency regulations will remain in effect during this rulemaking action.

Attached to this notice is the specific regulatory language of the proposed emergency action and the Finding of Emergency, which is also available on the HCAI website, at <a href="https://hcai.ca.gov/about/laws-regulations/#health-care-affordability">https://hcai.ca.gov/about/laws-regulations/#health-care-affordability</a>.

HCAI-OHCA plans to file the Emergency Rulemaking Package with OAL at least five working days after the date of this notice, above. If you wish to comment on the Finding of Emergency or the proposed emergency regulation, both HCAI-OHCA and OAL must receive comments within five calendar days of OHCA's filing with OAL. During an emergency filing of proposed regulations, it is HCAI-OHCA's right to respond to any public comment received in the five-day public comment period.
