HPD Program

- Assembly Bill 80 (Chapter 12, Statutes of 2020) provides HCAI the authority to establish the Health Care Payments Database (HPD) Program.
- The Health Care Payments Database (HPD) is California's All Payer Claims Database or APCD and is a
 research database comprised of healthcare administrative data: claims and encounters generated by
 transactions among payers and providers on behalf of insured individuals. It collects claim and encounter data
 as submitted from California payers.
- The information from the HPD System is intended to support greater health care cost transparency and will be
 used to inform policy decisions regarding the provision of quality health care, and to reduce health care costs
 and disparities. It is also intended for the information to be used to develop innovative approaches, services,
 and programs that may have the potential to deliver health care that is both cost effective and responsive to
 the needs of all Californians.
- To maximize its utility and value for California policymakers, researchers, and others interested in improving California's healthcare system, HCAI intends for the HPD to be as comprehensive and complete as possible by increasing the quality, volume, and variety of data collected over time.



HPD Data Access and Release

- HCAI is required to develop a comprehensive data access and release program and convene a
 Data Release Committee (DRC) to advise HCAI and review requests for access to nonpublic
 data.
- HPD public reports, such as <u>HPD Snapshot</u> and <u>HPD Measures</u>, provide examples for potential applicants to reference for what types of analyses may be possible with access to non-public HPD data.
- As California's APCD, the HPD contains data never before made available for research and analysis, providing an all-payer, all-setting, statewide view of the California healthcare system. Like other APCDs, the HPD contains common information used for billing, such as a patient's diagnosis, the procedure performed, and the amount paid for a claim.



Uses of HPD Data

HPD Uses:

HPD can be used to answer questions related to health care delivered to insured California patients and on topics related to:

- Systematic trends, such as comparing payers or counties
- Operational elements of the healthcare system, such as the utilization or cost of conditions and procedures
- Cost analyses based on claims data

HPD cannot be used for:

- Research about individual patients, the uninsured population, people who self-pay for health services, or about populations residing outside of California
- Research requiring clinical information such as medical chart notes or lab results
- Cost analyses based on non-claims data*



HPD Data Files

Available for request for years 2018-2023, the HPD uses the <u>APCD Common Data Layout</u> for file formats, which includes all the data elements available in the database. Potential applicants should review the data layout in preparation for submitting their application.

Medical Claims

• Contains medical claims and encounter data for primary and specialist care, outpatient surgeries, inpatient stays, and laboratory testing. This also includes data for home health care and nursing home care. Diagnoses, procedures, charged amounts, and paid amounts data is also included.

Pharmacy Claims

• Contains pharmacy data, such as drug names, quantity dispensed, charged amount, paid amounts. Provider and pharmacy information including name, specialty, location, and mail-order data is also included.

Member Eligibility

• Contains member identifiers, age, gender, and location data. Payer/health plan information, assigned primary care provider (PCP), and enrollment in person-centered medical home (PCMH) data is included.

Provider Information

· Contains provider identifiers, taxonomy/specialty, and location data.



Datasets Available for Request

Standard Limited

- Record-level and includes enrollment, medical, pharmacy, and provider data for commercial health plans and Medi-Cal.
- Pre-built to be suitable for a variety of analyses, with new plan years of data added annually.
- All direct identifiers for patients, providers, and health plans have been removed.

Standard Limited Plus

• Identical to the Standard Limited dataset, except it includes direct identifiers for providers and health plans.

Custom Limited

• Subsets of the Standard Limited or Standard Limited Plus datasets, architected during the collaborative request review process to best meet a requestor's/applicant's needs.

Research Identifiable

- Record-level and includes enrollment, medical, pharmacy, and provider data for commercial health plans and Medi-Cal.
- Contains direct patient identifiers, which are typically used to link to other datasets.



Methods of Access

Secure Data Enclave

- Centralized service for 24/7 remote access to sensitive data.
- Houses the data in a secure environment, protected in accordance with state and federal security and privacy rules, where it can be accessed via a virtual machine launched from the user's computer.
- Comes equipped with a suite of statistical tools and provides scalable computing power to perform analysis on a high volume of data.
- Datasets can only be downloaded from the Enclave after they have been properly de-identified and after HCAI administrator review and approval is granted.

Direct Transmission

- Direct Transmission is a method where HCAI sends copies of program data outside the secure data enclave directly to an individual or organization.
- Request for Direct Transmission of data will only be provided after a recommendation of approval by the HPD Data Release Committee.



HPD Data Sets: How to Apply

Standard Limited and Standard Limited+ Datasets

Before beginning, register an account with <u>HCAI's Data Request Portal</u>.







HPD Data Sets: How to Apply

Custom Limited and Research Identifiable Datasets

Before beginning, register an account with <u>HCAI's Data Request Portal</u>. When applying for a Research Identifiable Dataset, the Principal Investigator (PI) and Point of Contact will also need to register accounts with the CPHS online portal, <u>IRBManager</u>.







HPD Data Sets: Following Approval

Once your data request has been approved:

Data applicants will need to sign the Data Request Form and Data Use Agreement (DUA) and pay for their data. The requestor will be invoiced based on the HPD pricing schedule.

Accepted forms of payment are credit card and check. Payment instructions are provided in the data request portal.

ata Access

Enclave accounts and data access will be granted through the HCAI Secure Data Enclave within 2 weeks of final approval.

Direct transmission instructions will be provided for this method if selected.

ata Due Date

After a request has been approved, HCAI issues a Data Due Date, upon which the HCAI patient-level data must be destroyed or returned to HCAI.

Data Due Dates can be extended annually, to align with the requestor's CPHS protocol expiration date.

Request Changes

If there are changes or date extensions requested, requestors must notify HCAI of changes to the project.

lemental Requests

If a requestor wishes to make changes to their request such as adding additional data users, or requesting additional years of data, they will submit a Supplemental Request.



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HPD Data Request Application



Application Sections: High Level

Overview

- Data applicant information, qualifications, and prior experience
- Alignment of request with HPD purpose, goals, and requirements
- Submit data to HPD program
- Requesting a price reduction
- New or supplemental requests

Project Specific

- Description of project purpose, goals and data use/methods
- Requested HPD data product, timeframe of data, and desired delivery format
- List of data elements with justification based on project purpose
- DHCS data requested
- Proposed linkages to other sources with justification

Data Security


- Method of data access: Enclave or Direct Transmission
- Data user information
- Data security plan
- Description of how results and key findings will be shared
- Small cells

Additional Information

- Does the project offer significant opportunities to achieve HPD goals?
- All records vs. subsets of records
- Minimum data necessary
- Planned data products
- Applicant history, including the breaches/convictions/ civil actions





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
